APPARATUS OPERATIONS

PUMP OPERATIONS I

FSC 420.001

PUOP

PREREQUISITES: IST OR INTRODUCTION TO THE FIRE SERVICE AND 18 YOA!

This course provides the fire fighter with an introduction to basic pump construction and theory as well as operating techniques. Emphasis is placed on getting water to the pump, getting water from the pump to hose streams, and prevention of common mistakes in pump operations.

PUMP OPERATIONS II

FSC 421.001

PREREQUISITES: PUOP AND MUST BE 18 YEARS OF AGE FIRST DAY OF CLASS

This course is designed to instruct the student in advanced techniques of operating fire pumps. Topics covered include friction loss, relay pumping, master streams and elevated master streams.

DRIVER OPERATOR—PUMPER CERTIFICATION

FSC 787.001

PREREQUISITES: FIRE FIGHTER1, 18 YOA, EVOC ,
PUMP OPERATIONS I, PUMP OPERATIONS II, APPARATUS

PREVENTIVE MAINTENANCE TRAINING, AND CURRENT MOTOR VEHICLE DRIVERS LICENSE

This test is for national certification testing NFPA 1002 Driver Operator-Pumper. Candidates will be tested on the basic foundation for safe operation of a pumper apparatus through examination of hydraulics, pumping operations, emergency vehicle operation, inspection procedures, and driver evaluation. A written exam will be given Friday night with practical skills testing on Saturday and Sunday.

Candidates will be tested on the basic foundation of safe operation of an aerial device through examination of emergency vehicle operations, inspection procedures, driver evaluation, aerial operations and emergency procedures. A written exam will be given Friday night with practical skills testing on Saturday and Sunday.

COURSE OFFERINGS

EMERGENCY SERVICES ENTRY LEVEL

INTRODUCTION TO THE FIRE SERVICE

FSC 459.001

PREREQUISITES: NONE

The goal of this 16hr. program is to equip entry level firefighters with basic knowledge, skills, and abilities to begin their fire service career. Through classroom sessions and practical fieldwork, the recruit/new firefighter will learn how to function safely and effectively as a support member of a fire suppression organization. This course is designed to introduce new firefighters to basic information including an overview of the fire service, fire service organization, firefighter safety, personal protective equipment and terrorism awareness. This is the first of four courses in the curriculum.

GEAR: TURN OUT GEAR

OFFICER DEVELOPMENT

FIRE ARSON INVESTIGATION

FSC 733.001

ARIN

PREREQUISITES: ARSON DETECTION FOR THE 1ST RESPONDER, 5 YEARS AS FD CHIEF, LINE OFFICER or INVST. STUDENT MUST HAVE A COPY OF PREREQUISITE AND BRING THIS COPY TO CLASS!

This course will teach fire personnel to read patterns, and determine cause and origin, using actual burn sites. Identification will be practiced on different fire causes in buildings and vehicles. Excellent for experienced fire officers and investigators.

GEAR: TURN OUT GEAR

STRATEGY AND TACTICS FOR INITIAL COMPANY OPERATIONS

FSC 975.001

PREREQUISITES: ESSENTIALS OF FIRE FIGHTING OR INTERIOR FIRE FIGHTER (DELMAR), FF-1, AND INTRO TO FIRE OFFICERSHIP OR FO-1.

Strategy and tactics for initial company operations is designed to develop the management skills needed by the company officers (CO's) to accomplish assigned tactics at structure fires. This course was developed for newly appointed officer or fire fighters who have acting CO responsibilities, but it would provide an excellent review for experienced officers. (BCCC Certificate)

HIGHWAY SAFETY OPERATIONS

HIGHWAY INCIDENT SCENE SAFETY & MANAGEMENT

FSC 351.001

HSTC

PREREQUISITES: NONE

Students completing this course will be able to enhance responder and public safety at motor vehicle accidents and other highway incidents by implementing responder safe work practices and establishing emergency operations work zones that allow for restricted traffic movement options (versus full road closure) to be implemented whenever possible.

GEAR: NONE

MANAGEMENT NIMS REQUIREMENT PROGRAMS

ICS 300: Intermediate ICS for Expanding Incidents for Operational First Responders (O-465)

FSC 509.001

PREREQUISITES: NIMS ICS for the FIRE SERVICE NFA (NICS-FS), OR INCIDENT COMMAND SYSTEM NFA (ICS) PLUS NIMS IS-700, OR NIMS ICS for EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES NFA (ICS/EMS), OR INCIDENT COMMAND SYSTEM for EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES NFA (ICS/EMS) PLUS NIMS IS-700, OR AN EQUIVALENT COURSE) ACCREDITED BY THE EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT INSTITUTE (EMI), NATIONAL FIRE ACADEMY (NFA), NATIONAL WILDLAND COORDINATING GROUP (NWCG), OR THE NATIONAL PARK SERVICE (NPS).

TARGET AUDIENCE: Individuals who are expected to perform in a supervisory or tactical level management role at an incident or event. This includes individuals who may serve as Division or Group Supervisors, Branch Directors, Strike Team or Task Force Leaders, or Multi-Agency coordination system/emergency operations center (EOC) staff.

This course is designed to provide overall incident management skills rather than tactical expertise. The course will cover the implementation of the incident management process on Type 3 incidents, define a Type 3 incident and the development of an Incident Action Plan. Determining capabilities to match Incident complexity will be discussed. When and how to add appropriate ICS positions to match the complexity of the incident will be explored. The use of incident management teams will be discussed.

THIS COURSE IS 24 HOURS IN LENGTH AND BEGINS MARCH 12th AT 8:00AM AND ENDS MARCH 14th AT 5:00PM!

BUREAU OF FORESTRY TRAINING

BASIC WILDLAND FIRE FIGHTER – PA 130

FSC 632.001

WBFF

PREREQUISITES: NONE

This course will provide the student with the knowledge and skills needed to become a wildland fire fighter. Topics include: Organization and Fire Fighter Preparedness, Fire Fighting Tools, Suppression, Securing the Line, Mop-up, Overhaul, and Safety.

GEAR: FIRE, CONSTRUCTION OR CLIMBING HELMET WITH CHIN STRAP, EYE PROTECTION SUCH AS SAFETY GLASSES OR GOGGLES, LEATHER GLOVES, WORK OR HIKING BOOTS, OUTDOOR WORK CLOTHING OR COVERALLS. FIRE FIGHTING TURN OUT GEAR IS NOT SUITABLE FOR THIS CLASS.

RESCUE OPERATIONS

BUS RESCUE

FSC 238.001

BRES

PREREQUISITES: VEHICLE RESCUE I or PA DOH BASIC VEHICLE RESCUE - MUST BE 18 YEARS OF AGE FIRST DAY OF CLASS

Students taking this class will be able to define the scope to which buses are used daily, understand the different types of construction used to make buses, and learn to gain access, extricate, and stabilize patients, as required.

GEAR: TURN OUT GEAR, EYE PROTECTION (safety glasses or goggles)

RAPID INTERVENTION TEAM TRAINING (16HRS.)

FSC 760.001

PREREQUISITES: ESSENTIALS OF FIREFIGHTING - MUST BE 18 YEARS OF AGE FIRST DAY OF CLASS

This course is to teach fire fighters about safety accountability, large area search and rescuing downed fire fighters from structures. The students will actively engage in integrated exercises.

GEAR: TURN OUT GEAR, SCBA

BASIC VEHICLE RESCUE AWARENESS

FSC 178.001

BVRA

PREREQUISITES: NONE-MUST BE 16 YEARS OF AGE FIRST DAY OF CLASS

Upon completion of this course the student will have an understanding of vehicle rescue, hazards of vehicle rescue operations, the ICS phase of vehicle rescue and vehicle technology and design. This course is intended for personnel who need to have an awareness of vehicle rescue operations and how to assist at a rescue scene.

GEAR: TURN OUT GEAR - EYE PROTECTION - SAFETY GLASSES OR GOGGLES

SILO RESCUE

FSC 359.001

PREREQUISITES: IST OR INTRO TO THE FIRE SERVICE (ELIS)

In this course the emergency service worker will be introduced to the hazards of confined space and lockout/tag out procedures pertaining to silos. Other topics include silo construction equipment needs for rescue and basic rigging of ropes for silo rescue. GEAR: TURN OUT GEAR, SCBA

WATER RESCUE & EMERGENCY RESPONSE

FSC 446.001

WRER

PREREQUISITES: CURRENT CPR, ABILITY TO SWIM 50 YARDS, 18 YEARS OF AGE! This WRER program was developed for training fire and rescue department personnel. The Water Rescue & Emergency Response course covers planning for water emergencies, dynamics of moving water, medical conditions, personal safety, and fundamental rescue techniques (self and shore based rescue). The course provides students with classroom and hands-on training.

GEAR: SWIMSUIT, TOWEL, APPROPRIATE EXPOSURE SUIT, WHISTLE AND TYPE III OR TYPE IV PERSONAL FLOTATION DEVICE, WATER RESCUE HELMET.

ROPE/HIGH ANGLE RESCUE I

FSC 340.001

RORE

PREREQUISITES: IST or INTRODUCTION TO THE FIRE SERVICE

Students in this course will be re-introduced to the various types of rope and related rescue equipment. Students will be trained in tying of basic knots and hitches used in rope rescue, basic rappelling techniques, tie-offs, self-rescue, basic litter handling skills. Much of the program is hands-on and time is allotted for practice in order to build proficiency.

GEAR: HELMET WITH CHIN STRAP (fire, construction or climbing helmet), EYE PROTECTION, CLEAN LEATHER GLOVES, WORK OR HIKING BOOTS, OUTDOOR WORK CLOTHING OR COVERALLS. FIRE FIGHTER TURNOUT GEAR IS NOT APPROPRIATE FOR THIS CLASS.

(Helmet face shields are not suitable eye protection)

STUDENTS WILL ALSO NEED A 15 FOOT SECTION OF ROPE AND A 15 FOOT PIECE OF TUBULAR WEBBING FOR KNOT PRACTICE.

CONFINED SPACE RESCUE

FSC 324.001

CSR

PREREQUISITES: ROPE 1 AND 18 YEARS OF AGE.

Students will learn plans of operation, tools, labor resources, and manipulation skills required to perform safe removal of victims from limited space confinement. Emphasis is placed on safety and the psychological effects of confined space rescue. Students will participate in team rescue scenarios.

GEAR: HELMET WITH CHIN STRAP, EYE PROTECTION, LEATHER GLOVES, WORK BOOTS, WORK CLOTHES OR COVERALLS APPROPRIATE FOR WEATHER CONDITIONS

HAZARDOUS MATERIALS PACKAGE

FSC 856.001

STUDENT WILL BE REGISTERED FOR ALL 3 COURSES.

PA STATE FIRE ACADEMY WEFR-ACADEMY ON THE ROAD

"Wellsite Emergency First Responder" Training Program

Continuing the efforts to reduce the number of fire fighter injuries and Line of Duty Deaths, State Fire Commissioner Ed Mann and the Marcellus Shale Coalition and the Pennsylvania Independent Oil and Gas Association have combined forces in presenting this informative program to fire departments and municipal officials throughout the Commonwealth.

The Office of the State Fire Commissioner-Pennsylvania State Fire Academy is offering this recently adopted 4 hour class. The program describes the activities that are normally a part of a Marcellus Shale Gas Field project and some of the emergencies that could occur at or near the site.

Subjects included in the "Well Site Emergency First Responders" program include well site selection and preparation, rigging up and well construction, completing the well and rigging down, the production phase, and the role of the emergency responder. (PA State Fire Academy/Academy on the Road Certificate)

NATURAL GAS/PROPANE/CARBON MONOXIDE SEMINAR

PREREQUISITES: IST OR INTRODUCTION TO THE FIRE SERVICE

This course discusses properties of these three gases. In addition, this course covers the health risks to first responders. Topics include hazard control, physical and chemical properties, and monitoring devices and techniques used during the management of these incidents. (BCCC Certificate)

GEAR: NONE

"Gas Well Fire Fighting" Training Program

PREREQUISITES: NONE

This program is for emergency responders and will describe activities and possible emergency situations associated with a Marcellus Shale gas field site. The program includes well site selection, rigging up, construction, completion, rigging down, and production. The role of the emergency responder will also be discussed in more detail.

GEAR: NONE

COURSE OFFERINGS

FIRE GROUND OPERATIONS

ENGINE COMPANY OPERATIONS

FSC 205.001 ECOP

PREREQUISITES: EBM OR INTERIOR FIRE FIGHTING OR FF-1 CERT.

This course provides instruction in the duties and responsibilities of an engine company. Topics include: fire behavior and spread in structures, positioning of apparatus, use of attack and backup lines, search and rescue, and water supply. A series of hands-on drills involving various engine company evolutions follows the classroom discussion.

GEAR: TURN OUT GEAR, SCBA

TRUCK COMPANY OPERATIONS I

FSC 209.001 TRCO

PREREQUISITES: ESSENTIALS OF FIRE FIGHTING or INTERIOR FIRE FIGHTER (ELIF)

This course will introduce the student to the basic duties of a truck company including hand and power tool operation, search and rescue, and ventilation. Truck Company support to Engine Company is also covered.

GEAR: TURN OUT GEAR, SCBA

RESPIRATORY PROTECTION II

FSC 311.001 REPA

PREREQUISITES: REPR

This advanced training will enhance the fire fighters capabilities, build their confidence in using the apparatus and prepare them for more complex situations that they may encounter.

GEAR: TURNOUT GEAR, SCBA

CIVILIAN AND FIRE FIGHTER RESCUE PROCEDURES

FSC 838.001

PREREQUISITES: EBM OR INTERIOR FIRE FIGHTING

This program provides students with basic and advanced procedures for searching and removing victims and trapped or downed fire fighters from a building under fire conditions. Topics covered include: fire conditions and hazard recognition, search and rescue strategies, specialized search and rescue techniques, problems associated with trapped or injured victims, and risk assessment strategies for search and rescue operations.

GEAR: TURN OUT GEAR, SCBA

STRUCTURAL FIRE RESCUE

FSC 325.001 SFR

PREREQUISITES: EBM OR INTERIOR FIRE FIGHTING

This course will instruct the students in methods of rescuing victims from buildings under fire conditions. Topics discussed and practiced are search procedures, victim handling techniques, and methods of removing victims from above and below grade situations.

GEAR: TURN OUT GEAR, SCBA

FORCIBLE ENTRY

FSC 700.001 TFE

PREREQUISITES: ESSENTIALS OF FIRE FIGHTING OR EXTERIOR FIRE FIGHTER and Must be 18 Years of Age.

This course will provide the fire fighter with a better understanding of building construction. Also covered are opening techniques and the use of tools for safe and quick access into a structure.

GEAR: TURN OUT GEAR, GOGGLES OR SAFETY GLASSES (HELMET FACE SHIELDS ARE NOT SUFFICIENT EYE PROTECTION!)

"FLASHOVER SIMULATOR"

"TWO WEEKEND OFFERINGS

FSC900.001 MARCH 19 & 20, 2011

FSC900.002 MARCH 26 & 27, 2011

COURSE FEE ALLOWS ATTENDANCE AT ONLY ONE OFFERING!

PREREQUISITES: INTRODUCTION TO SAFETY AND TRAINING, ESSENTIALS OF FIRE FIGHTING and RESPIRATORY PROTECTION

The "Flashover Simulator" is a safe and realistic way to experience the actual conditions of fire behavior before and during a flashover. Topics include: fire behavior, nozzle techniques, and safety factors involving flashovers.

1. This course is not a Pennsylvania State Fire Academy course and they are not responsible for the course content.
2. Certificates for this course will not be issued by the Bucks County Community College or the Pennsylvania State Fire Academy.
3. Certificates will be issued by the MUNCY AREA MUTUAL AID (MAMA).
4. There is a \$65.00 lab fee for this course in addition to the \$70.00 registration fee. (\$135.00 total) or (\$175.00) for out of state residents.
5. Fire fighters with health conditions that prevent them from doing normal fire fighting activities should not register for this course.
6. Due to the fact that live fire is used in the simulations, junior fire fighters may not register for this course. Must be 18 YEARS of AGE!
7. Enrollment For This Course Is Limited To The First 20 Registrations Received.

3 COURSE SPECIAL MED / TRAUMA EMS CONTINUING EDUCATION UNITS PACKAGE

FSC 902.001 PREREQUISITES: PA. DEPT. OF HEALTH FR or EMT-B or EMT-P

MASS CASUALTY INCIDENT OVERVIEW AND PRACTICAL TRAINING

This program is designed to give emergency medical personnel the skills and knowledge necessary to operate effectively at a Mass Casualty Incident (MCI). Topics include environmental hazards, MCI plan components, response criteria and agency roles, SMART theory of triage and treatment and integrated MCI exercise.

S.M.A.R.T. TRIAGE

This program provides a rapid and systematic approach to the triage process, concepts and procedures for triage, and multiple casualty incident management. Through both lecture and practical exercises the students will gain a better understanding of the complexities and specific issues involving these types of events.

PRE-HOSPITAL SPINAL IMMOBILIZATION

This course covers the normal structure and function of the spine, injuries to the spine, principles of patient assessment, principles of treatment, special consideration for extended patient management and medical legal issues. The equipment for spinal immobilization is also covered in this program.

GEAR: NONE

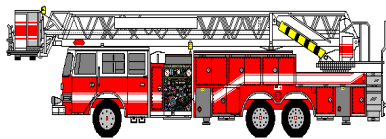
IMPORTANT PLEASE READ COURSE PREREQUISITE INFORMATION

Courses that have no prerequisite requirements are considered entry level and do not require any prior knowledge of the subject matter of the course. Courses that require prerequisites are advanced level training designed to build on the student's prior knowledge of a subject. Prerequisites are **REQUIRED** for a particular course in order to insure that the student has a basic understanding of the knowledge and skills that are necessary to complete the requirements of a course. When a chief or supervisor signs the authorization for a student to attend a class, he or she is attesting that the student has the background necessary to complete the requirements of the course that they have registered for. 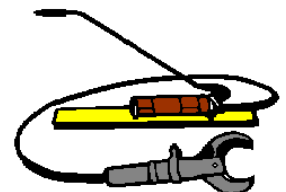
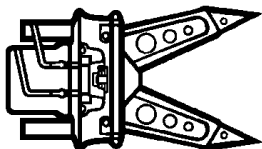
