COURSE OFFERINGS

APPARATUS OPERATIONS

PUMP OPERATIONS I

FSC 420.001

PUOP

PREREQUISITES: IST OR INTRODUCTION TO THE FIRE SERVICE AND 18 YOA!

This course provides the fire fighter with an introduction to basic pump construction and theory as well as operating techniques. Emphasis is placed on getting water to the pump, getting water from the pump to hose streams, and prevention of common mistakes in pump operations.

GEAR: TURN OUT GEAR

PUMP OPERATIONS II

FSC 421.001

PUOA

PREREQUISITES: PUOP AND MUST BE 18 YEARS OF AGE FIRST DAY OF CLASS

This course is designed to instruct the student in advanced techniques of operating fire pumps. Topics covered include friction loss, relay pumping, master streams and elevated master streams.

NATIONAL CERTIFICATION TESTING

DRIVER OPERATOR—PUMPER CERTIFICATION

FSC 787.001

PREREQUISITES: FIRE FIGHTER1, 18 YOA, EVOC, PUMP OPERATIONS I, PUMP OPERATIONS II, APPARATUS

PREVENTIVE MAINTENANCE TRAINING, AND CURRENT MOTOR VEHICLE DRIVERS LICENSE

This test is for national certification testing NFPA 1002 Driver Operator-Pumper. Candidates will be tested on the basic foundation for safe operation of a pumper apparatus through examination of hydraulics, pumping operations, emergency vehicle operation, inspection procedures, and driver evaluation. A written exam will be given Friday night with practical skills testing on Saturday and Sunday.

DRIVER OPERATOR—AERIAL CERTIFICATION

FSC 788.001

PREREQUISITES: FF-1 (IFSAC OR PROBOARD), 18 YOA, EVOC, AERIAL OPERATIONS, APPARATUS PREVENTIVE MAINTENANCE TRAINING PROGRAM, AND CURRENT MOTOR VEHICLE LICENSE

This test is for national certification testing to NFPA 1002 Driver Operator-Aerial. Candidates will be tested on the basic foundation of safe operation of an aerial device through examination of emergency vehicle operations, inspection procedures, driver evaluation, aerial operations and emergency procedures. A written exam will be given Friday night with practical skills testing on Saturday and Sunday.

DRIVER OPERATOR—MOBILE WATER SUPPLY APPARATUS

FSC 524.001

PREREQUISITES: FF-1 (IFSAC or PROBOARD), 18 YOA, EVOC, CURRENT MOTOR VEHICLE DRIVERS LICENSE.

This test is for national certification to NFPA 1002 Driver Operator Mobile Water Supply. Candidates will be tested on the basic foundation of safe operation of a tender/mobile water supply vehicle, pre-trip inspection, road course test and applicable skills for mobile water supply operations involving this type of apparatus.

COURSE OFFERINGS

EMERGENCY SERVICES ENTRY LEVEL

INTRODUCTION TO THE FIRE SERVICE

FSC 459.001

PREREQUISITES: NONE

The goal of this 16hr. program is to equip entry level firefighters with basic knowledge, skills, and abilities to begin their fire service career. Through classroom sessions and practical fieldwork, the recruit/new firefighter will learn how to function safely and effectively as a support member of a fire suppression organization. This course is designed to introduce new firefighters to basic information including an overview of the fire service, fire service organization, firefighter safety, personal protective equipment and terrorism awareness. This is the first of four courses in the curriculum.

GEAR: TURN OUT GEAR

OFFICER DEVELOPMENT

FIRE ARSON INVESTIGATION

FSC 733.001

ARIN

PREREQUISITES: ARSON DETECTION FOR THE 1ST RESPONDER, 5 YEARS AS FD CHIEF, LINE OFFICER or INVST. STUDENT MUST HAVE A COPY OF PREREQUISITE AND BRING THIS COPY TO CLASS!

This course will teach fire personnel to read patterns, and determine cause and origin, using actual burn sites. Identification will be practiced on different fire causes in buildings and vehicles. Excellent for experienced fire officers and investigators.

GEAR: TURN OUT GEAR

INTRODUCTION TO FIRE OFFICERSHIP

FSC 226.001

INFO

PREREQUISITES: ESSENTIALS OF FIREFIGHTER OR EQUIVALENT

This course will give the student a basic overview of fire ground officer responsibilities, personnel issues, fire ground operations, and the development of a sound and effective administrative and fire ground organizational structure.

HIGHWAY SAFETY OPERATIONS

HIGHWAY INCIDENT SCENE SAFETY & MANAGEMENT

FSC 351.001

HSTC

PREREQUISITES: NONE

Students completing this course will be able to enhance responder and public safety at motor vehicle accidents and other highway incidents by implementing responder safe work practices and establishing emergency operations work zones that allow for restricted traffic movement options (versus full road closure) to be implemented whenever possible.

GEAR: NONE

2 COURSE FIRE FIGHTING OPERATIONS PACKAGE

FSC 907.001

SCBA EMERGENCIES AND FIRE FIGHTER SELF-RESCUE

PREREQUISITES: ESSENTIALS OF FIRE FIGHTING OR DELMAR INTERIOR FIRE FIGHTER

This program offers an extreme challenge to the experienced fire fighter. SCBA failure is any firefighter's worst nightmare. This course provides the student the knowledge and skills to confidently manage the dangers and hazards associated with SCBA failure or limitations. Topics include: regulator failure, entanglement and disorientation, buddy breathing, regulator changeover, as well as, maneuvering through a challenging maze configuration. All evolutions will be conducted in live smoke conditions. The student must have prior knowledge and skills in the advanced use of SCBA to participate in this training session.

GEAR: TURN OUT GEAR and SCBA

THERMAL IMAGING CAMERA OPERATIONS

PREREQUISITES: THERMAL IMAGING FOR THE FIRE SERVICE

This program is designed to enhance the student's understanding of thermal imaging technology. Various options and application strategies will be presented in this program. The student will understand technology limitations, thermal imaging "generation changes," instructional challenges, as well as technological advancements in the field of thermal imaging.

GEAR: TURN OUT GEAR and SCBA

BUREAU OF FORESTRY TRAINING

BASIC WILDLAND FIRE FIGHTER – PA 130

FSC 632.001

WBFF

PREREQUISITES: NONE

This course will provide the student with the knowledge and skills needed to become a wildland fire fighter. Topics include: Organization and Fire Fighter Preparedness, Fire Fighting Tools, Suppression, Securing the Line, Mop-up, Overhaul, and Safety.

GEAR: FIRE, CONSTRUCTION OR CLIMBING HELMET WITH CHIN STRAP, EYE PROTECTION SUCH AS SAFETY GLASSES OR GOGGLES, LEATHER GLOVES, WORK OR HIKING BOOTS, OUTDOOR WORK CLOTHING OR COVERALLS.

FIRE FIGHTING TURN OUT GEAR IS NOT SUITABLE FOR THIS CLASS.

RESCUE OPERATIONS

CONFINED SPACE RESCUE

FSC 324.001 CSR

PREREQUISITES: ROPE 1 AND 18 YEARS OF AGE.

Students will learn plans of operation, tools, labor resources, and manipulation skills required to perform safe removal of victims from limited space confinement. Emphasis is placed on safety and the psychological effects of confined space rescue. Students will participate in team rescue scenarios.

GEAR: HELMET WITH CHIN STRAP, EYE PROTECTION, LEATHER GLOVES, WORK BOOTS, WORK CLOTHES OR COVERALLS APPROPRIATE FOR WEATHER CONDITIONS

RAPID INTERVENTION TEAM TRAINING (16HRS.)

FSC 760.001

PREREQUISITES: ESSENTIALS OF FIREFIGHTING - MUST BE 18 YEARS OF AGE
FIRST DAY OF CLASS

This course is to teach fire fighters about safety accountability, large area search and rescuing downed fire fighters from structures. The students will actively engage in integrated exercises.

GEAR: TURN OUT GEAR, SCBA

BASIC VEHICLE RESCUE AWARENESS

FSC 178.001 BVRA

PREREQUISITES: NONE-MUST BE 16 YEARS OF AGE FIRST DAY OF CLASS

Upon completion of this course the student will have an understanding of vehicle rescue, hazards of vehicle rescue operations, the ICS phase of vehicle rescue and vehicle technology and design. This course is intended for personnel who need to have an awareness of vehicle rescue operations and how to assist at a rescue scene.

GEAR: TURN OUT GEAR – EYE PROTECTION – SAFETY GLASSES OR GOGGLES

BASIC VEHICLE RESCUE OPERATIONS

FSC 177.001 BVRO

PREREQUISITES: BASIC VEHICLE RESCUE AWARENESS-MUST BE 16 YEARS OF AGE FIRST DAY OF CLASS

This module is intended for those responders WHO have already completed the awareness level course. This course teaches the student the use of hand tools as they relate to vehicle extrication and how to quickly and safely access and package patients for removal from damaged vehicles

GEAR: TURN OUT GEAR – EYE PROTECTION – SAFETY GLASSES OR GOGGLES

ROPE/HIGH ANGLE RESCUE II

FSC 339.001 RORA

PREREQUISITES: ROPE/HIGH ANGLE RESCUE I

Students in this course will be re-introduced to the various types of rescue equipment. Students will be trained in: mechanical advantage systems, basic ascending, basic rappelling technique and tie-offs with a rappel rack, rope changes, and one person rescue. The student will perform a low angle raise and lower evolution simulating patient transport on embankments. Most of the program is hands-on and time is allotted for practice in order to build proficiency.

GEAR: HELMET WITH CHIN STRAP (fire, construction or climbing helmet), EYE PROTECTION (safety glasses or goggles) , CLEAN LEATHER GLOVES, WORK OR HIKING BOOTS, OUTDOOR WORK CLOTHING OR COVERALLS AND HARNESS.
FIRE FIGHTER TURNOUT GEAR IS NOT APPROPRIATE FOR THIS CLASS.

(Helmet face shields are not suitable eye protection)

STUDENTS WILL ALSO NEED A 15 FOOT SECTION OF ROPE AND A 15 FOOT PIECE OF TUBULAR WEBBING FOR KNOT PRACTICE.

SPECIAL VEHICLE RESCUE

FSC 414.001 DHSV

PREREQUISITES: BASIC VEHICLE RESCUE TECHNICIAN, MUST BE 18 YEARS OF AGE FIRST DAY OF CLASS

This course builds upon the knowledge and skills acquired in the basic Vehicle Rescue Technician course to prepare the student to deal with rescue situations involving larger vehicle such as buses and large trucks. A written examination is administered at the conclusion of this course for the certification as DOH Special Vehicle Rescue Technician.

GEAR: TURN OUT GEAR – EYE PROTECTION – SAFETY GLASSES OR GOGGLES

CIVILIAN AND FIRE FIGHTER RESCUE PROCEDURES

FSC 838.001

PREREQUISITES: EBM OR INTERIOR FIRE FIGHTING

This program provides students with basic and advanced procedures for searching and removing victims and trapped or downed fire fighters from a building under fire conditions. Topics covered include: fire conditions and hazard recognition, search and rescue strategies, specialized search and rescue techniques , problems associated with trapped or injured victims, and risk assessment strategies for search and rescue operations.

GEAR: TURN OUT GEAR, SCBA

HAZARDOUS MATERIALS PACKAGE

FSC 909.001

CLANDESTINE DRUG LABORATORY-OPERATIONS LEVEL

PREREQUISITES: ESSENTIALS OF FF OR DELMAR INTERIOR FF-MUST BE 18 YOA

This program addresses the safety considerations for emergency response actions for clandestine drug labs. Clandestine Drug Laboratories, often considered chemical time bombs, present a dangerous unknown condition to unsuspecting emergency responders. This course brings to light the inherent dangers and exposure conditions often associated with these clandestine processes. This program will leave the student with a comprehensive overview of the best practices response actions for a safe and successful response. Subjects to be covered include site safety procedures, associated hazards, clandestine lab indicators and a basic understanding of chemicals and their associated safety issues.

GEAR: NONE

HAZARDOUS MATERIALS DECONTAMINATION PROCEDURES

PREREQUISITES: HAZARDOUS MATERIALS OPERATIONS-MUST BE 18 YOA

This course is designed to teach fire fighters and EMS personnel effective techniques for the decontamination of response personnel and victims exposed to released chemicals. The course will provide basic information on contaminated patient handling, decontamination station setup, recommended decontamination procedures, the selection and donning of the PPE used for decontamination, and termination procedures for safe breakdown of the station.

GEAR: TOG and SCBA

COURSE OFFERINGS

FIRE GROUND OPERATIONS

ENGINE COMPANY OPERATIONS

FSC 205.001 ECOP

PREREQUISITES: EBM OR INTERIOR FIRE FIGHTING OR FF-1 CERT.

This course provides instruction in the duties and responsibilities of an engine company. Topics include: fire behavior and spread in structures, positioning of apparatus, use of attack and backup lines, search and rescue, and water supply. A series of hands-on drills involving various engine company evolutions follows the classroom discussion.

GEAR: TURN OUT GEAR, SCBA

TRUCK COMPANY OPERATIONS I

FSC 209.001 TRCO

PREREQUISITES: ESSENTIALS OF FIRE FIGHTING or INTERIOR FIRE FIGHTER (ELIF)

This course will introduce the student to the basic duties of a truck company including hand and power tool operation, search and rescue, and ventilation. Truck Company support to Engine Company is also covered.

GEAR: TURN OUT GEAR, SCBA

RESPIRATORY PROTECTION I

FSC 307.001 REPR

PREREQUISITES: ESSENTIALS OF FIRE FIGHTING

This course gives the student a chance to become proficient in the use of SCBA. It allows ample time to practice various skills and perform several exercises with their SCBA. This course is particularly useful as a review for experienced fire service personnel or as an introductory course for persons (such as EMS) who use SCBA in a hazardous atmosphere other than fire conditions.

GEAR: TURN OUT GEAR, SCBA

"FLASHOVER SIMULATOR"

TWO WEEKEND OFFERINGS

FSC900.001 MARCH 17 & 18, 2012

FSC900.002 MARCH 24 & 25, 2012

COURSE FEE ALLOWS ATTENDANCE AT ONLY ONE OFFERING!

PREREQUISITES: INTRODUCTION TO SAFETY AND TRAINING, ESSENTIALS OF FIRE FIGHTING and RESPIRATORY PROTECTION

The "Flashover Simulator" is a safe and realistic way to experience the actual conditions of fire behavior before and during a flashover. Topics include: fire behavior, nozzle techniques, and safety factors involving flashovers.

1. This course is not a Pennsylvania State Fire Academy course and they are not responsible for the course content.
2. Certificates for this course will not be issued by the Bucks County Community College or the Pennsylvania State Fire Academy.
3. Certificates will be issued by the MUNCY AREA MUTUAL AID (MAMA).
4. There is a \$65.00 lab fee for this course in addition to the \$65.00 registration fee. (\$130.00 total) or (\$170.00) for out of state residents.
5. Fire fighters with health conditions that prevent them from doing normal fire fighting activities should not register for this course.
6. Due to the fact that live fire is used in the simulations, junior fire fighters may not register for this course. Must be 18 YEARS of AGE!
7. Enrollment For This Course Is Limited To The First 20 Registrations Received.
8. Students will receive a letter from the Muncy Area Mutual Aid fire training committee confirming your registration and providing additional information.

GEAR: TURN OUT GEAR, SCBA, LONG SLEEVED COTTON SHIRT AND PANTS

VENTILATION PRACTICES

FSC 310.001

PREREQUISITES: EBM OR INTERIOR FIRE FIGHTING

This course will cover what ventilation is, why we do it, and how to obtain proper ventilation. Horizontal and vertical ventilation will be discussed along with the methods including natural and mechanical. Positive pressure ventilation will be introduced and demonstrated. Ventilation as a defensive operation will also be talked about including trench cutting. The course will have the students involved in hands-on exercises performing the skills listed on a mock roof and ventilating a building mechanically that is charged with training smoke.

GEAR: TURN OUT GEAR, SCBA

STRUCTURAL FIRE RESCUE

FSC 325.001 SFR

PREREQUISITES: EBM OR INTERIOR FIRE FIGHTING

This course will instruct the students in methods of rescuing victims from buildings under fire conditions. Topics discussed and practiced are search procedures, victim handling techniques, and methods of removing victims from above and below grade situations.

GEAR: TURN OUT GEAR, SCBA

FORCIBLE ENTRY

FSC 700.001 TFE

PREREQUISITES: ESSENTIALS OF FIRE FIGHTING or EXTERIOR FIRE FIGHTER and MUST BE 18 YEARS OF AGE.

This course will provide the fire fighter with a better understanding of building construction. Also covered are opening techniques and the use of tools for safe and quick access into a structure.

GEAR: TURN OUT GEAR, GOGGLES OR SAFETY GLASSES (HELMET FACE SHIELDS ARE NOT SUFFICIENT EYE PROTECTION!)

ATTENTION! THERE IS AN ADDITIONAL \$65.00 LAB FEE FOR EXPENDABLE ITEMS TO BE CUT AND FORCED FOR THIS PROGRAM. A TOTAL OF \$130.00 PER STUDENT TO ENROLL IS REQUIRED WHEN YOUR REGISTRATION FORM IS SUBMITTED.

COURSE OFFERINGS

3 COURSE SPECIAL MED / TRAUMA EMS CONTINUING EDUCATION UNITS PACKAGE

FSC 902.001 PREREQUISITES: PA. DEPT. OF HEALTH FR or EMT-B or EMT-P

EMS & THE CRIME SCENE

This course will cover the "do's and don'ts" for scene safety at a scene involving a death. It will give a basic briefing about evidence, crime scenes, moving or tampering with evidence, patient assessment and body removal.

SCENE SIZE-UP AND INITIAL PATIENT ASSESSMENT

This course reviews scene size-up and safety issues, as well as the performance of an initial patient assessment. This program will enhance student proficiency in assessing scene hazards and life threatening conditions. The course is from the National Standard Curriculum for the first responder and EMT.

Poisoning and Overdose Emergencies

This course reviews emergency care procedures for managing poisonings and overdoses. Also reviewed are signs and symptoms, indicators, contraindicators, airway management considerations, and medications.

GEAR: NONE

The course includes guidelines and scenario practice applying ICS for EMS personnel. Resource information for setting up a department ICS is also provided.

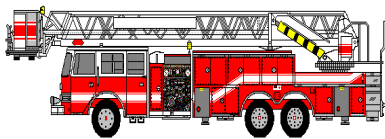
IMPORTANT PLEASE READ COURSE PREREQUISITE INFORMATION

Courses that have no prerequisite requirements are considered entry level and do not require any prior knowledge of the subject matter of the course. Courses that require prerequisites are advanced level training designed to build on the student's prior knowledge of a subject. Prerequisites are **REQUIRED** for a particular course in order to insure that the student has a basic understanding of the knowledge and skills that are necessary to complete the requirements of a course. When a chief or supervisor signs the authorization for a student to attend a class, he or she is attesting that the student has the background necessary to complete the requirements of the course that they have registered for. Students must complete all requirements of a class in order to receive a certificate.

STUDENTS REGISTERING FOR COURSES WHICH HAVE PREREQUISITE REQUIREMENTS WILL BE REQUIRED TO BRING COPIES OF THEIR CERTIFICATES TO CLASS ON SATURDAY MORNING. INSTRUCTORS WILL VERIFY THAT THE STUDENT IS QUALIFIED TO ATTEND THE COURSE.

Registration deadline is February 24, 2012. You may register for classes after this deadline and up to the morning of the school on March 17, 2012. 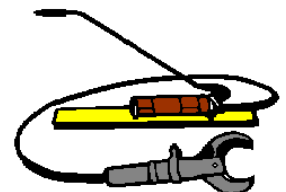
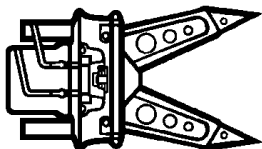
