COURSE OFFERINGS

PUMP OPERATIONS I

FSC 420.001

PUOP

PREREQUISITES: IST OR INTRODUCTION TO THE FIRE SERVICE AND 18 YEARS OF AGE FIRST DAY OF CLASS

This course provides the fire fighter with an introduction to basic pump construction and theory as well as operating techniques. Emphasis is placed on getting water to the pump, getting water from the pump to hose lines, and prevention of common mistakes in pump operations.

GEAR: TURN OUT GEAR

PUMP OPERATIONS II

FSC 421.001

PUOA

PREREQUISITES: PUOP AND MUST BE 18 YEARS OF AGE FIRST DAY OF CLASS

This course is designed to instruct the student in advanced techniques of operating pumps. Topics covered include friction loss, relay pumping, master streams and elevated master streams.

GEAR: TURN OUT GEAR

RESPIRATORY PROTECTION 1

FSC 0307.001

REPR

PREREQUISITES: IST OR INTRODUCTION TO THE FIRE SERVICE AND 18 YEARS OF AGE FIRST DAY OF CLASS

This program gives the student a chance to become proficient in the use of S.C.B.A., allowing ample time to practice various skills and perform several exercises with their S.C.B.A. This course is particularly useful as a review for experienced fire service personnel or as an introductory course for persons (such as EMS) who use SCBA in a hazardous atmosphere other than fire conditions. Students attending this program will become familiar with basic techniques for using S.C.B.A.; and will demonstrate safe methods of donning, doffing, using, cleaning and servicing S.C.B.A.

SATURDAY MORNING CLASSES

Fire Dynamics Fundamental FDF

FSC 800.001 Class is on Saturday AM (3 hr Class)

PREREQUISITES: 14 YEARS OF AGE OR OLDER FIRST DAY OF CLASS

GEAR: NONE

This course provides the firefighter the basic knowledge to reinforce the evidence based research conducted by Underwriters Laboratories, National Institute of Standards and Technology, Alcohol Tobacco and Firearms and other fire service organizations. This course introduces new terminology related to fire dynamics, legacy versus modern fuel loads, new construction techniques, flow paths, door control, and ventilation that all impact fire ground operations.

RESPONDING TO UTILITY EMERGENCIES-Natural Gas

FSC 623.001 Class is on Saturday AM (3 hr Class)

PREREQUISITES: 14 YEARS OF AGE OR OLDER FIRST DAY OF CLASS

GEAR: NONE

This program is designed to increase general awareness of natural gas at the scene; provide responders with specific safety skills to recognize and identify hazards and develop proper attitudes when responding to natural gas emergencies. This course will address the hazards, risks, response and players (utility and public service) involved in responding to emergencies involving natural gas.

SATURDAY 8 HR CLASSES

CLANDESTINE DRUG LABS: OPERATIONS LEVEL

FSC 847.001 Class is on Saturday (8 hr Class)

PREREQUISITES: 18 YOA OR OLDER, EBM OR ELIF OR BBFA OR FF1

GEAR: NONE

This program addresses the safety considerations for emergency response actions for clandestine drug labs. This course brings to light the inherent dangers and exposure conditions often associated with these clandestine processes. This program will leave the student with a comprehensive overview of best practices defensive response actions in order to maintain responder safety.

HAZMAT OPS REFRESHER

FSC 737.001 Class is on Saturday (6 hr Class)

PREREQUISITES: 16 YOA OR OLDER, Hazardous Materials Operation

GEAR: NONE

This program was designed as annual refresher training for students who have taken the Hazardous Materials Operations Level 472 course and provide hands on opportunities to exhibit the practical skills learned as part of that program.

SUNDAY MORNING CLASSES

CARBON MONOXIDE DETECTOR RESPONSES (CORE)

FSC 502.001 Class is on Saturday AM (3 hr Class)

PREREQUISITES: 16 YEARS OF AGE OR OLDER FIRST DAY OF CLASS

GEAR: NONE

The course is designed to familiarize the student with a conceptual understanding of the technology, the purpose and operation of a residential CO detector, information regarding fire department dispatch decisions, considerations for response, considerations for investigation, a framework for working with outside agency assistance and resources for public education.

SUNDAY AFTERNOON CLASSES

WIND ENERGY AWARENESS FOR THE FIRE SERVICE

FSC 643.001 Class is on Saturday AM (3 hr Class)

PREREQUISITES: 14 YEARS OF AGE OR OLDER FIRST DAY OF CLASS

GEAR: NONE

This course addresses the associated hazards and safe work practices for the emergency response strategies involving wind energy systems. The course will introduce students to wind energy components and terminology, system operations, design features, associated hazardous, and recommended practices for emergency response actions.

SUNDAY 8 HR CLASSES

AUTOMATIC DETECTION AND SUPPRESSION SYSTEMS (AUTO)

FSC 525.001 Class is on SUNDAY (8 hr Class)

PREREQUISITES: 16 YOA OR OLDER FIRST DAY OF CLASS

GEAR: NONE

This course is designed to give the fire officer, fire prevention official, and code enforcement official a basic understanding of the design and operation of fire alarm and fire protection system.

FIRE FIGHTER SELF-PRESERVATION AND MAYDAY TRAINING

FSC 812.001 Class is on SUNDAY (8 hr Class)

PREREQUISITES: 18 YOA OR OLDER

GEAR: PPE / SCBA

Students will experience scenarios where they will be required to take appropriate life saving actions in residential and commercial structures. Topics include Mayday procedures, entanglement, and SCBA emergencies.

RESCUE OPERATIONS

ADVANCED RAPID INTERVENTION TEAM TRAINING

FSC 770.001

PREREQUISITES: 18 YOA OR OLDER, EBM or INTERIOR FIREFIGHTING, OR BBFA or FF1

GEAR: TURN OUT GEAR, SCBA

This course will review of the Basic RIT Team Exercises including size up, new techniques for locating and removing trapped and injured firefighters, information regarding recent fire fighter fatalities, and recent RIT survival accounts, as well as, current RIT developments.

VEHICLE RESCUE AWARENESS-NFPA 1670

FSC 1178.001 NVRA

PREREQUISITES: STUDENT MUST BE 16 YEARS OF AGE THE FIRST DAY OF CLASS.

GEAR: TURN OUT GEAR – EYE PROTECTION – SAFETY GLASSES OR GOGGLES

This course will provide an awareness level of information and skills as it pertains to vehicle rescue incidents. Topics will include general vehicle rescue function/operation; incident management of the vehicle accident/rescue incident; vehicle anatomy, design, and construction; recognition and control of hazards relative to a vehicle accident/rescue incident; and the tools and equipment used at a vehicle accident/rescue incident.

ATTENTION!

There is an extra \$65.00 lab fee for all students that register for the Special Vehicle Rescue Class

There is an extra \$30.00 lab fee for all students that register for the Vehicle Rescue Awareness Class

ROPE HIGH ANGLE RESCUE II

FSC 339.001 RORA

PREREQUISITES: Age 16 and up, and RORE

Students in this course will be re-introduced to the various types of rope and related rescue equipment. Students will be trained in: mechanical advantage systems, safeties, basic ascending, basic rappelling technique and tie-offs with a rappel rack, rope changes, and one person rescue. The students will perform a low angle raise and lower evolution simulating patient transport on embankments. Most of the program is hands-on and time is allotted for practice in order to build proficiency.

GEAR: HELMET WITH CHIN STRAP (fire, construction or climbing helmet), EYE PROTECTION (safety glasses or goggles), CLEAN LEATHER GLOVES, WORK OR HIKING BOOTS, OUTDOOR WORK CLOTHING OR COVERALLS AND A CLASS III HARNESS. FIRE FIGHTER TURNOUT GEAR IS NOT APPROPRIATE FOR THIS CLASS.

(Helmet face shields are not suitable eye protection)

STUDENTS WILL ALSO NEED A 15 FOOT SECTION OF ROPE AND A 15 FOOT PIECE OF TUBULAR WEBBING FOR KNOT PRACTICE.

SPECIAL VEHICLE RESCUE

FSC 414.001 DHSV

PREREQUISITES: BASIC VEHICLE RESCUE TECHNICIAN MUST BE 18 YEARS OF AGE FIRST DAY OF CLASS

GEAR: TURN OUT GEAR – EYE PROTECTION – SAFETY GLASSES OR GOGGLES

This course builds upon the knowledge and skills acquired in the basic Vehicle Rescue Technician course to prepare the student to deal with rescue situations involving larger vehicles such as buses and large trucks. A written examination is administered at the conclusion of this course for certification as DOH Special Vehicle Rescue Technician.

OFFICER DEVELOPMENT

DECISION MAKING FOR INITIAL COMPANY OFFICER (DMICO)

FSC 765.001

PREREQUISITES: 18 YEARS OF AGE OR OLDER BY FIRST DAY OF CLASS Entry Level Fire Training (EBM, ELIF, BBFA, or FF-1)

GEAR: NONE

This course is designed to develop a better understanding of the roles and responsibilities of a Company Officer as they relate to NIMS, Fireground Decision Making, Building Construction types as well as Burn Time Considerations and LODDs from Collapse Incidents while preparing their company for incident operations.

ADVANCED FIRE POLICE (FIPA)

FSC 0635.001 MUST BE 18 YEARS OF AGE OR OLDER

GEAR: NONE

To set forth facts that fire police training must be, in depth, continuous and expanding; that only persons with intelligent dedication can meet the strict demands required for this type of duty assignment. This course will touch upon training and the training officer's qualifications, policy & procedures, legal liabilities, court appearance, leadership, communications and public relations, defensive driving, traffic control, security, self-protection and uniforms.

THE STUDENT WILL BE REQUIRED TO PURCHASE THE SOMERSET CAMBRIA FIRE POLICE ASSOCIATION, BEYOND THE BASICS TEXTBOOK

COURSE OFFERINGS

FIRE GROUND OPERATIONS

ENGINE COMPANY OPERATIONS

FSC 205.001 ECOP

PREREQUISITES: EBM OR INTERIOR FIRE FIGHTING OR FF-1 CERT.

MUST BE 18 YEARS OF AGE.

GEAR: TURN OUT GEAR, SCBA

This course provides instruction in the duties and responsibilities of an engine company. Topics include: fire behavior and spread in structures, positioning of apparatus, use of attack and backup lines, search and rescue, and water supply. A series of hands-on drills involving various engine company evolutions follows the classroom discussion.

TRUCK COMPANY OPERATIONS I

FSC 209.001 TRCO

PREREQUISITES: EBM OR EQUIVILANT MUST BE 18 YEARS OF AGE.

GEAR: TURN OUT GEAR, SCBA

The student will be introduced to the basic concept of truck company operations as part of an organized, coordinated structural fire suppression operation. Truck companies, regardless of whether they arrive on an aerial device, squad, or engine, are the 'combat engineers' of fire attack operations.

VEHICLE FIRES AND OTHER EMERGENCIES

FSC 308.001 VFOE

PREREQUISITES: Age 18 and up, EBM or Interior Fire-Fighting or BBFA or FF1

GEAR: TURN OUT GEAR, SCBA

This course will inform the student of the hazards encountered at vehicle fires and other emergencies. Proper strategy and tactics covered as well as the changes that have occurred in vehicle design that have an effect on the way vehicle fires must be handled.

STRUCTURAL FIRE RESCUE

FSC 325.001 SFR

PREREQUISITES: EBM OR INTERIOR FIRE FIGHTING. MUST BE 18 YEARS OF AGE

GEAR: TURN OUT GEAR, SCBA

This course will instruct the students in methods of rescuing victims from buildings under fire conditions. Topics discussed and practiced are search procedures, victim handling techniques, and methods of removing victims from above and below grade situations.

FORCIBLE ENTRY

FSC 700.001 TFE

PREREQUISITES: ESSENTIALS OF FIRE FIGHTING or EXTERIOR FIRE FIGHTER.

MUST BE 18 YEARS OF AGE.

GEAR: TURN OUT GEAR, GOGGLES OR SAFETY GLASSES (HELMET FACE SHIELDS ARE NOT SUFFICIENT EYE PROTECTION!)

This course will provide the fire fighter with a better understanding of building construction. Also covered are opening techniques and the use of tools for safe and quick access into a structure.

INTRODUCTION TO THE FIRE SERVICE ELIS

FSC 2459.001

PREREQUISITES: MUST BE 14 YEARS OF AGE BY FIRST DAY OF CLASS

GEAR: TURN OUT GEAR

This entry level course is designed to introduce new firefighters to basic information including an overview of the fire service, fire service organization, firefighter safety, personal protective equipment, tools and emergency lighting, and backing apparatus. This is the first of five levels (courses) in the curriculum

ATTENTION! ALL STUDENTS MUST BRING AN IFSTA ESSENTIALS OF FIREFIGHTING 6th EDITION TEXT BOOK. THESE ARE NOT SUPPLIED FOR THIS COURSE!

STUDENTS REPORTING TO CLASS WITHOUT THE REQUIRED TEXT BOOK AND WORK/SKILLS BOOKS WILL NOT BE ADMITTED AND THE WEEKEND REGISTRATION FEE WILL BE FORFEITED! ALL STUDENTS ATTENDING THIS PROGRAM WILL RECEIVE A MANDATORY READING ASSIGNMENT LETTER TO PREPARE FOR THIS PROGRAM IN ADVANCE!

"FLASHOVER SIMULATOR"

FSC900.001 MARCH 18 & 19, 2017

COURSE FEE ALLOWS ATTENDANCE AT ONLY ONE OFFERING!

CLASS IS LIMITED TO 20 STUDENTS

PREREQUISITES: INTRODUCTION TO SAFETY AND TRAINING, ESSENTIALS OF FIRE FIGHTING and RESPIRATORY PROTECTION

The "Flashover Simulator" is a safe and realistic way to experience the actual conditions of fire behavior before and during a flashover. Topics include: fire behavior, nozzle techniques, and safety factors involving flashovers.

1. This course is not a Pennsylvania State Fire Academy course and they are not responsible for the course content.
2. Certificates for this course will not be issued by the Bucks County Community College or the Pennsylvania State Fire Academy. Certificates will be issued by the MUNCY AREA MUTUAL AID (MAMA).
3. There is a \$65.00 lab fee for this course in addition to the \$65.00 registration fee (\$135.00 total) or (\$170.00) for out of state residents.
4. Fire fighters with health conditions that prevent them from doing normal fire fighting activities should not register for this course.
5. Due to the fact that live fire is used in the simulations, junior fire fighters may not register for this course. Must be 18 YEARS OF AGE!
6. Enrollment For This Course Is Limited To The First 20 Registrations Received.
7. Students will receive a letter from the Muncy Area Mutual Aid fire training committee confirming your registration and providing additional information.

4 COURSE SPECIAL MED / TRAUMA EMS CONTINUING EDUCATION UNITS PACKAGE

FSC 902.001 PREREQUISITES: PA. DEPT. OF HEALTH EMR,EMT,Paramedic

Autism Awareness for First Responders

About 1 in 68 children are diagnosed with an autism spectrum disorder (ASD) according to estimates from the Center for Disease Control's (CDC) Autism and Developmental Disabilities Monitoring (ADDM) Network (2014). ASDs are reported to occur in all racial, ethnic, and socioeconomic groups. Children with ASD are 7 times more likely to have the need for emergency services and firefighters need to be aware of their special needs.

Street Drug Awareness

This course will review drugs used by street level consumers, to include methods of consumption, equipment used, and effects of drugs on those who consume it.

Focused History & Physical Exam, Trauma Patients

This program is designed as a continuing education program for the DOH certified EMT-B. The course reviews patient assessment, as it relates to trauma patients. The student will thoroughly assess the body regions susceptible to traumatic impact or shock.

Ballistic Injuries

This program is designed as a continuing education program for the DOH certified First Responder, EMT-B and Paramedic. The course reviews ballistic injuries and overall safety for responders and the patient. This program will review emergency care procedures for ballistic injuries caused by firearms, other projectiles and explosives.

STUDENT WILL BE REGISTERED FOR ALL 4 COURSES.

WILDERNESS SEARCH AND RESCUE

FSC 0815.001 WRSR

PREREQUISITES: STUDENT MUST BE 16 YEARS OF AGE THE FIRST DAY OF CLASS.

Course is presented in a combination of classroom and field work to present basic search operation techniques and organizational skills to the first responding units and requested resources during a missing person incident.

GEAR: HELMET WITH CHIN STRAP (fire, construction or climbing helmet), EYE PROTECTION (safety glasses or goggles), WORK OR HIKING BOOTS, OUTDOOR WORK CLOTHING OR COVERALLS AND FIRE FIGHTER TURNOUT GEAR IS NOT APPROPRIATE FOR THIS CLASS.

A.L.I.C.E.

FSC 627.

The class is a 4 hour class with the first 1 ½ to 2 hrs. being class/ slide presentation followed by the remainder of the class role playing and acting out the training by utilizing what is taught in class. In today's world, it's unfortunate that every day, we can turn on a news station and see a tragic mass shooting/attack somewhere in the United States. Don't think for a second, that it cannot happen in your home town. This training will open your eyes and help change your mind set in how you go about your everyday activities. When a chief or supervisor signs the authorization for a student to attend a class, he or she is attesting that the student has the background necessary to complete the requirements of the course. Students must complete all requirements of a class in order to receive a certificate.

PRE-REGISTRATION INFORMATION

PRE-REGISTRATION DEADLINE IS FEBRUARY 17, 2017

Applicants must be the posted years of age or older by the first date of class. All students must be authorized by their chief or supervisor to attend. Junior fire fighters may not enroll in any course which involves live fire or live fire smoke. The Pennsylvania State Fire Academy policy on facial hair will be strictly enforced.

REGISTRATIONS FOR ALL COURSES WILL BE HANDLED BY BUCKS COUNTY COMMUNITY COLLEGE, YOUR EDUCATIONAL PROVIDER. The basic fee for the MAMA Emergency Services Training Weekend is \$70.00 which includes facilities, expendable materials costs, lunch and refreshments both days. Any student who is not a resident of Pennsylvania must pay an additional \$40.00 (\$110.00 total).

ALL REGISTRATIONS MUST BE ACCOMPANIED BY A CHECK OR MONEY ORDER DRAWN TO B.C.C.C. OR A CREDIT CARD ACCOUNT NUMBER (MUST INCLUDE 3 DIGIT V CODE) OR COMPANY/DEPARTMENT PURCHASE ORDER NUMBER.

Students who register for the SPECIAL VEHICLE RESCUE , FORCIBLE ENTRY CLASS OR FLASHOVER SIMULATOR are required to pay an additional \$65.00 lab fee (\$135.00 total for PA residents or \$175.00 total for out of state residents.).
