## COURSE OFFERINGS

### PUMP OPERATIONS I

FSC 420.001

PUOP

**PREREQUISITES: IST OR INTRODUCTION TO THE FIRE SERVICE AND 18 YEARS OF AGE FIRST DAY OF CLASS**

This course provides the fire fighter with an introduction to basic pump construction and theory as well as operating techniques. Emphasis is placed on getting water to the pump, getting water from the pump to hose lines, and prevention of common mistakes in pump operations.

**GEAR: TURN OUT GEAR**

### PUMP OPERATIONS II

FSC 421.001

PUOA

**PREREQUISITES: PUOP AND MUST BE 18 YEARS OF AGE FIRST DAY OF CLASS**

This course is designed to instruct the student in advanced techniques of operating pumps. Topics covered include friction loss, relay pumping, master streams and elevated master streams.

**GEAR: TURN OUT GEAR**

### RESPIRATORY PROTECTION I

FSC 0307.001

REPR

**PREREQUISITES: IST OR INTRODUCTION TO THE FIRE SERVICE AND 18 YEARS OF AGE FIRST DAY OF CLASS**

This program gives the student a chance to become proficient in the use of S.C.B.A., allowing ample time to practice various skills and perform several exercises with their S.C.B.A. This course is particularly useful as a review for experienced fire service personnel or as an introductory course for persons (such as EMS) who use SCBA in a hazardous atmosphere other than fire conditions. Students attending this program will become familiar with basic techniques for using S.C.B.A.; and will demonstrate safe methods of donning, doffing, using, cleaning and servicing S.C.B.A.

### PICK AND CHOOSE A COMBINATION OF HALF DAY OR FULL DAY CLASSES LISTED BELOW TO FILL OUT YOUR TRAINING WEEKEND

#### SATURDAY MORNING CLASSES

##### **RESPONDING TO UTILITY EMERGENCIES-Natural Gas**

**FSC 623.001 Class is on Saturday AM (4 hr Class)**

**PREREQUISITES: 14 YEARS OF AGE OR OLDER FIRST DAY OF CLASS**

**GEAR: NONE**

This program is designed to increase general awareness of natural gas at the scene; provide responders with specific safety skills to recognize and identify hazards and develop proper attitudes when responding to natural gas emergencies. This course will address the hazards, risks, response and players (utility and public service) involved in responding to emergencies involving natural gas.

##### **Emergency Preparedness for Severe Weather**

**FSC 859.001 Class is on Saturday AM (3 hr Class)**

**PREREQUISITES: 14 YEARS OF AGE OR OLDER FIRST DAY OF CLASS**

**GEAR: NONE**

This program is designed to enhance the student's understanding of weather related emergencies and to enhance their preparatory and planning skills for such events. This course covers the differences between weather watch and weather warning. Identification of the various warning systems for Pennsylvania will be covered in this program. This course will also involve case studies of major storm/weather events and associated hazards.

#### SATURDAY 8 HR CLASSES

##### **PUBLIC INFORMATION OFFICER**

**FSC 289.001 Class is on Saturday (6 hr Class)**

**PREREQUISITES: 16 YOA OR OLDER FIRST DAY OF CLASS**

**GEAR: NONE**

This program is designed to give the students the skills required to act as a PIO in an emergency and non-emergency situation.

##### **CLANDESTINE DRUG LABS: OPERATIONS LEVEL**

**FSC 847.001 Class is on Saturday (8 hr Class)**

**PREREQUISITES: 18 YOA OR OLDER, EBM OR ELIF OR BBFA OR FF1**

**GEAR: NONE**

This program addresses the safety considerations for emergency response actions for clandestine drug labs. This course brings to light the inherent dangers and exposure conditions often associated with these clandestine processes. This program will leave the student with a comprehensive overview of best practices defensive response actions in order to maintain responder safety.

#### SUNDAY 8 HR CLASSES

##### **AUTOMATIC DETECTION AND SUPPRESSION SYSTEMS (AUTO)**

**FSC 525.001 Class is on SUNDAY (8 hr Class)**

**PREREQUISITES: 16 YOA OR OLDER FIRST DAY OF CLASS**

**GEAR: NONE**

This course is designed to give the fire officer, fire prevention official, and code enforcement official a basic understanding of the design and operation of fire alarm and fire protection system.

##### **ELEVATOR RESCUE EMERGENCIES**

**FSC 0548.001 Class is on SUNDAY (8 hr Class)**

**PREREQUISITES: 18 YOA OR OLDER**

**GEAR: HELMET, GLOVES, BOOTS, EYE PROTECTION**

Through classroom sessions and application exercises, this course addresses the procedures for preparing, assessing, and safe and effective rescue involving elevators. This course is intended for the technician level rescuer to give them the ability to function, accurately, safely, and effectively during rescue incidents involving this mode of public transportation. Topics include: hazard assessment and size-up, resource management considerations, equipment identification, types of emergency responses, patient considerations, extrication procedures, crush syndrome, lockout/tagout procedures, pre-incident planning, and application of techniques and equipment through simulated, integrated exercises.

##### **ROLES AND RESPONSIBILITIES WITHIN EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT (HLS006)**

**FSC 0291.001 Class is on Sunday (6 hr Class)**

**PREREQUISITES: 16 YOA OR OLDER FIRST DAY OF CLASS**

**GEAR: NONE**

This program is designed to give the students an understanding and knowledge of roles and responsibilities with the Incident Command System. The program will focus on the five major functions within the system.

#### SATURDAY AFTERNOON CLASSES

##### **RESPONDING TO UTILITY EMERGENCIES-Electrical**

**FSC 618.001 Class is on Saturday PM (4 hr Class)**

**PREREQUISITES: 14 YEARS OF AGE OR OLDER FIRST DAY OF CLASS**

**GEAR: NONE**

This program is designed to increase general awareness of electricity at the scene; provide responders with specific safety skills to recognize and identify hazards and develop proper attitudes when responding to electrical emergencies. This course will address the hazards, risks, response and players (utility and public service) involved in responding to emergencies involving electricity.

##### **Report Writing and Presentations**

**FSC 888.001 Class is on Saturday PM (3 hr Class)**

**PREREQUISITES: 14 YEARS OF AGE OR OLDER FIRST DAY OF CLASS**

**GEAR: NONE**

This program is designed to enhance the student's understanding of how to construct a comprehensive incident report. The course identifies the importance of complete reports, as well as, the role in the report in the investigative process. This program provides the student with insight on case studies presented by fire service officials with experience with legal testimony. Topics include: technical writing skills, community service presentations, investigative process, data collection and

##### **LEGAL ASPECTS: COMMAND OFFICER**

**FSC 0931.001 Class is on Saturday (8 hr Class)**

**PREREQUISITES: 16 YOA OR OLDER FIRST DAY OF CLASS**

**GEAR: NONE**

This program is to provide legal issue awareness to Line and Command Officers. This program will provide the student with an overview of the laws and standards as they apply to emergency service managers. Discussions will relate to specific laws and standards that relate to organizational operations and service delivery. This program places emphasis upon the development of knowledge used by emergency service managers to achieve an efficient documentation system and departmental operating guidelines. This course will include; lecture, group discussion, and simulated situation responses.

##### **RECRUITMENT AND RETENTION SEMINAR**

**FSC 1010.001 Class is on SUNDAY (8 hr Class)**

**PREREQUISITES: 16 YOA OR OLDER FIRST DAY OF CLASS**

**GEAR: NONE**

This class is for both administrative and line officers as well as those individuals who are responsible to bring new members into the fire department. This course will provide some of the techniques to successful recruitment and retention programs that have shown a proven track record.

##### **ELECTRIC VEHICLES SAFETY FOR EMERGENCY RESPONDERS**

**FSC 0120.001 Class is on SUNDAY (6hr Class)**

**PREREQUISITES: 16 YOA OR OLDER FIRST DAY OF CLASS**

**GEAR: NONE**

This program contains information on hybrid and electric vehicle safety and technology upgrades, which may pose concerns with extrication efforts. This course covers basic vehicle safety and technology changes at an emergency response level. Operating systems, construction and safety features are discussed throughout the program. Safety features such as: air bag systems, seat belt pretension systems, fuel system and charging stations, safe work zones, low, medium, and high voltage systems, vehicle construction materials, hybrid vehicles, and passenger compartment upgrades.

# RESCUE OPERATIONS

## BASIC RAPID INTERVENTION TEAM TRAINING

FSC 760.001

PREREQUISITES: 18 YOA OR OLDER, EBM or INTERIOR FIREFIGHTING, OR BBFA or FF1

GEAR: TURN OUT GEAR, SCBA

This course is designed to provide firefighters with the knowledge and skill objectives to safely perform rescue techniques to remove trapped or lost firefighters during deteriorating suppression activities. This course is for firefighters who are members of a RIT, and tasked with extrication responsibilities during structure fires. Included in this course: RIT Team roles and responsibilities, evaluation of case studies, function during suppression activities, lifting and moving techniques, extrication support needs, team building skills, and size-up techniques and structure layout. The fire fighter will also participate in "live" scenario based evaluations involving a down/trapped firefighter.

## VEHICLE RESCUE AWARENESS-NFPA 1670

FSC 1178.001 NVRA

PREREQUISITES: STUDENT MUST BE 16 YEARS OF AGE THE FIRST DAY OF CLASS.

GEAR: TURN OUT GEAR – EYE PROTECTION – SAFETY GLASSES OR GOGGLES

This course will provide an awareness level of information and skills as it pertains to vehicle rescue incidents. Topics will include general vehicle rescue function/operation; incident management of the vehicle accident/rescue incident; vehicle anatomy, design, and construction; recognition and control of hazards relative to a vehicle accident/rescue incident; and the tools and equipment used at a vehicle accident/rescue incident.

## ROPE/HIGH ANGLE RESCUE I (RORE)

FSC 340.001

PREREQUISITES: 16 YOA BY THE FIRST DAY OF CLASS

: Students in this course will be introduced to the various types of rope and related rescue equipment. Students will be training in tying of the basic knots and hitches used in rope rescue, basic rappelling techniques, tie-offs, self-rescue, basic litter tie-ins, and basic litter handling skills. Much of the program is hands-on and time is allotted for practice in order to build proficiency.

GEAR: HELMET WITH CHIN STRAP (fire, construction or climbing helmet), EYE PROTECTION (safety glasses or goggles), CLEAN LEATHER GLOVES, WORK OR HIKING BOOTS, OUTDOOR WORK CLOTHING OR COVERALLS AND A CLASS III HARNESS. FIRE FIGHTER TURNOUT GEAR IS NOT APPROPRIATE FOR THIS CLASS.

(Helmet face shields are not suitable eye protection)

STUDENTS WILL ALSO NEED A 15 FOOT SECTION OF ROPE AND A 15 FOOT PIECE OF TUBULAR WEBBING FOR KNOT PRACTICE.

## SPECIAL VEHICLE RESCUE

FSC 414.001

DHSV

PREREQUISITES: BASIC VEHICLE RESCUE TECHNICIAN MUST BE 16 YEARS OF AGE FIRST DAY OF CLASS

GEAR: TURN OUT GEAR – EYE PROTECTION – SAFETY GLASSES OR GOGGLES

This course builds upon the knowledge and skills acquired in the basic Vehicle Rescue Technician course to prepare the student to deal with rescue situations involving larger vehicles such as buses and large trucks. A written examination is administered at the conclusion of this course for certification as DOH Special Vehicle Rescue Technician.

# OFFICER DEVELOPMENT

## STRATEGY AND TACTICS FOR INITIAL COMPANY OPERATIONS (STICO)

FSC 975.001

PREREQUISITES: 18 YEARS OF AGE OR OLDER BY FIRST DAY OF CLASS Entry Level Fire Training (EBM, ELIF, BBFA, or FF-1)

GEAR: NONE

Strategy and Tactics for Initial Company Operations is designed to develop the management skills needed by Company Officers (CO's) to accomplish assigned tactics at structure fires. This course was developed for newly appointed officers or firefighters who have acting CO responsibilities, but it would provide an excellent review for

## BASIC FIRE POLICE

FSC 0604.001 MUST BE 18 YEARS OF AGE OR OLDER

GEAR: NONE

: This course was designed to prepare persons selected to be fire police officers to know the initial legal requirements and to understand how to perform the basic duties of the position. This course sets for the NEED for fire police; their legal police power; personal and professional qualifications; their appointment and control; their general and special duties; and their limitations.

## INTRO TO FIREOFFICERSHIP

FSC 0226.001 MUST BE 18 YEARS OF AGE OR OLDER

GEAR: NONE

This course will give those students wishing to become Fire Officers, the ability to function safely and effectively as a management component of a fire/rescue organization. Effective management skills and styles will be covered as well as effective communications, progressive discipline, philosophy of management, organizational skills, and Company Officer strategy and tactical considerations.

# COURSE OFFERINGS

## FIRE GROUND OPERATIONS

### ENGINE COMPANY OPERATIONS

FSC 205.001

ECOP

**PREREQUISITES: EBM OR INTERIOR FIRE FIGHTING OR FF-1 CERT.**

**MUST BE 18 YEARS OF AGE.**

**GEAR: TURN OUT GEAR, SCBA**

This course provides instruction in the duties and responsibilities of an engine company. Topics include: fire behavior and spread in structures, positioning of apparatus, use of attack and backup lines, search and rescue, and water supply. A series of hands-on drills involving various engine company evolutions follows the classroom discussion.

### TRUCK COMPANY OPERATIONS II

FSC 208.001

ATRC

**PREREQUISITES: EBM OR EQUIVILANT / TRUK 1**

**MUST BE 18 YEARS OF AGE.**

**GEAR: TURN OUT GEAR, SCBA**

This course is designed to build upon and refine the knowledge and skills involved in providing effective truck company operations that were acquired by the student in Truck Company Operations I course. This course will allow the student to practice and further refine his/her ability to effectively and safely perform the fireground duties normally assigned to truck companies.

### VEHICLE FIRES AND OTHER EMERGENCIES

FSC 308.001

VFOE

**PREREQUISITES: Age 18 and up, EBM or Interior Fire-Fighting or BBFA or FF1**

**GEAR: TURN OUT GEAR, SCBA**

This course will inform the student of the hazards encountered at vehicle fires and other emergencies. Proper strategy and tactics covered as well as the changes that have occurred in vehicle design that have an effect on the way vehicle fires must be handled.

### FIREFIGHTER SURVIVAL

FSC 202.001

**PREREQUISITES: EBM OR INTERIOR FIRE FIGHTING. MUST BE 18 YEARS OF AGE**

**GEAR: TURN OUT GEAR, SCBA**

This program is a physically demanding, comprehensive program dealing with the necessary knowledge and skills relative to rescue procedures needed for self rescue. Emphasis will be placed on search techniques, communications, accountability/location and self rescue procedures. This program will teach the firefighters how to reduce the risk of fire fighter injuries and deaths in Pennsylvania. The class will enable fire fighters to become more aware and familiar with procedures that may be used to prevent or perhaps lessen the seriousness of injuries or even save their lives. Students must be in adequate physical condition to perform 100% of all practical exercises.

### FORCIBLE ENTRY

FSC 700.001

TFE

**PREREQUISITES: ESSENTIALS OF FIRE FIGHTING or EXTERIOR FIRE FIGHTER.**

**MUST BE 18 YEARS OF AGE.**

**GEAR: TURN OUT GEAR, GOGGLES OR SAFETY GLASSES (HELMET FACE SHIELDS ARE NOT SUFFICIENT EYE PROTECTION!)**

This course will provide the fire fighter with a better understanding of building construction. Also covered are opening techniques and the use of tools for safe and quick access into a structure.

### INTRODUCTION TO THE FIRE SERVICE ELIS

FSC 2459.001

**PREREQUISITES: MUST BE 14 YEARS OF AGE BY FIRST DAY OF CLASS**

**GEAR: TURN OUT GEAR**

This entry level course is designed to introduce new firefighters to basic information including an overview of the fire service, fire service organization, firefighter safety, personal protective equipment, tools and emergency lighting, and backing apparatus. This is the first of five levels (courses) in the curriculum

## "FLASHOVER SIMULATOR"

FSC900.001 MARCH 17 & 18, 2018

COURSE FEE ALLOWS ATTENDANCE AT ONLY ONE OFFERING!  
CLASS IS LIMITED TO 20 STUDENTS

**PREREQUISITES: INTRODUCTION TO SAFETY AND TRAINING, ESSENTIALS OF FIRE FIGHTING and RESPIRATORY PROTECTION**  
The "Flashover Simulator" is a safe and realistic way to experience the actual conditions of fire behavior before and during a flashover. Topics include: fire behavior, nozzle techniques, and safety factors involving flashovers.

1. This course is not a Pennsylvania State Fire Academy course and they are not responsible for the course content.
2. Certificates for this course will not be issued by the Bucks County Community College or the Pennsylvania State Fire Academy. Certificates will be issued by the MUNCY AREA MUTUAL AID (MAMA).
3. There is a \$65.00 lab fee for this course in addition to the \$65.00 registration fee (\$135.00 total) or (\$170.00) for out of state residents.
4. Fire fighters with health conditions that prevent them from doing normal fire fighting activities should not register for this course.
5. Due to the fact that live fire is used in the simulations, junior fire fighters may not register for this course. Must be 18 YEARS OF AGE!
6. Enrollment For This Course Is Limited To The First 20 Registrations Received.
7. Students will receive a letter from the Muncy Area Mutual Aid fire training committee confirming your registration and providing additional information.

# COURSE OFFERINGS

## 4 COURSE SPECIAL MED / TRAUMA EMS CONTINUING EDUCATION UNITS PACKAGE

FSC 902.001 PREREQUISITES: PA. DEPT. OF HEALTH EMR,EMT,Paramedic

### MASS CASUALTY INCIDENT REVIEW

This program is designed to give emergency medical personnel the skills and knowledge necessary to operate effectively at a MCI (mass casualty incident). This program combines lecture and problem solving exercises that will enhance the student's ability to manage, triage, treat, and transport larger numbers of patients. Topics covered are: environmental hazards, MCI plan components, response criteria, agency roles, unit and personnel responsibilities, size techniques, START theory of triage and treatment, and integrated MCI problem solving exercises.

### EMS AND THE CRIME SCENE

This course is designed to teach the EMS practitioner about the common mistakes made while on a scene involving a death. It gives a briefing about evidence, crime scene logs, moving or tampering with evidence, patient assessment, body removal, and the "do's and don'ts" for scene safety in suicidal cases. This is the standard course of instruction that is approved by the Pennsylvania Department of Health for continuing education credits.

### BASELINE VITAL SIGNS & SAMPLE HISTORY, EMT-B (1-5)

This program is a continuing education program for the DOH certified EMT-B. The course reviews baseline how to obtain reliable vital signs and "SAMPLE" history. This course reviews how to take and interpret baseline vitals: respiratory rate, pulse, skin, pupils, blood pressure, and capillary refill. This program will prepare the student to become medically competent in the assessment and management of injured or medically distressed patients. This program follows the baseline vitals & sample history module found in the National Standard Curriculum. This is the standard course of instruction approved by the Pennsylvania Department of Health for continuing education credits.

### POSING AND OVERDOSE EMERGENCES

This program is designed as a continuing education program for the DOH certified EMT. The course reviews the emergency care procedures for managing poisonings and overdoses. This program will review the signs and symptoms, indicators, contra-indicators, airway management considerations, and medications. The curriculum is based on the poisoning/overdose module and practical application of emergency care procedures, found in the National Education Standards. This is the standard course of instruction approved by the Pennsylvania Department of Health for continuing education credits.

STUDENT WILL BE REGISTERED FOR ALL 4 COURSES.

## IMPORTANT PLEASE READ COURSE PREREQUISITE INFORMATION

Courses that have no prerequisite requirements are considered entry level and do not require any prior knowledge of the subject matter of the course. Courses that require prerequisites are advanced level training designed to build on the student's prior knowledge of a subject. Prerequisites are REQUIRED for a particular course to ensure that the student has a basic understanding of the knowledge and skills that are necessary to complete the requirements of a course. When a chief or supervisor signs the authorization for a student to attend a class, he or she is attesting that the student has the background necessary to complete the requirements of the course. Students must complete all requirements of a class in order to receive a certificate.

STUDENTS REGISTERING FOR COURSES WHICH HAVE PREREQUISITE REQUIREMENTS WILL BE REQUIRED TO BRING COPIES OF THEIR CERTIFICATES TO CLASS ON SATURDAY MORNING. INSTRUCTORS WILL VERIFY THAT THE STUDENT IS QUALIFIED TO ATTEND THE COURSE.

Registration deadline is February 28, 2018. You may register for classes after this deadline (and up to the morning at the school on March 17, 2018). However your selection of classes will be limited to those that are not cancelled after February 17th and will be subject to space availability due to class enrollment.

PRE-REGISTRATION INFORMATION

PRE-REGISTRATION DEADLINE IS FEBRUARY 28, 2018

Applicants must be the posted years of age or older by the first date of class. All students must be authorized by their chief or supervisor to attend. Junior fire fighters may not enroll in any course which involves live fire or live fire smoke. The Pennsylvania State Fire Academy policy on facial hair will be strictly enforced.

REGISTRATIONS FOR ALL COURSES WILL BE HANDLED BY BUCKS COUNTY COMMUNITY COLLEGE, YOUR EDUCATIONAL PROVIDER. The basic fee for the MAMA Emergency Services Training Weekend is \$70.00 which includes facilities, expendable materials costs, lunch and refreshments both days. Any student who is not a resident of Pennsylvania must pay an additional \$40.00 (\$110.00 total).

ALL REGISTRATIONS MUST BE ACCOMPANIED BY A CHECK OR MONEY ORDER DRAWN TO B.C.C.C. OR A CREDIT CARD ACCOUNT NUMBER (MUST INCLUDE 3 DIGIT V CODE) OR COMPANY/DEPARTMENT PURCHASE ORDER NUMBER.

Students who register for the SPECIAL VEHICLE RESCUE , FORCIBLE ENTRY CLASS OR FLASHOVER SIMULATOR are required to pay an additional \$65.00 lab fee (\$135.00 total for PA residents or \$175.00 total for out of state residents.). Students who register for the VEHICLE RESCUE AWARENESS & VEHICLE FIRES are required to pay an additional \$30.00 lab fee (\$100.00 total for PA residents or \$140.00 for out of state residents).

No telephone registrations will be accepted. Only students paying by credit card or company/department purchase order may fax their registration to 215-343-6794. Pre-registration is necessary and should be done EARLY. Class sizes are limited in number and are filled on a first come basis. Students are requested to select up to three of the two day seminars in order of priority. Applicants should only select courses that they desire to be enrolled in. ANY COURSE MAY BE CANCELLED DUE TO INSUFFICIENT ENROLLMENT OR OTHER CIRCUMSTANCES.

In case of course cancellation or if a course is filled, students are automatically placed in the next class choice indicated on the registration form. If another choice is not indicated on the form, the student's registration fee will be returned. Students will be notified of course cancellations or any other changes as soon as possible.
